




Recycling

Warm Hearts Warm Lives also held a recycling contest this past project year. **Angelina Manjarres** collected 1,347 recyclables winning 1st place and **Skylar Pandorf** collected 780 recycables taking 2nd place. **Charlee McGatha, Alaina Begley** and **Erika Koster** also participated in the contest.

In total the group collected 5,553 recyclables valued at \$277.60 to benefit rescues. Prizes are compliments of Warm Hearts. The club worked in collaboration with Team Redeem.







Club Updates

Warm Hearts Warm Lives

This past 4-H year the total amount we raised from our fundraising efforts amounted to \$1,851.94 and the total amount we raised from recycling amounted to \$279.20 for a grand total of \$2,131.14.

Overall since the inception of the club in November 2016 we raised \$21,814.42 from

fund raising, we collected 41,126 recyclables and 95,353 pull tabs.
