4-H Animal Science Video Contest and Film Festival

Videos along with entry form and media release(s) due March 6, 2023 Film Festival and Awards Presentation – March 25, 2023

Youth may work individually or as a team to create educational videos about alpacas, cats, cattle (beef/dairy), dogs, goats, herpetology, horses, llamas, poultry, rabbits, sheep, small animals, or swine to enter in the NJ 4-H Animal Science Video Contest. A selection of videos will be shared at the film festival during an afternoon session of the Junior Breeder Livestock Symposium. Youth of the top scoring videos will receive awards. Videos will be scored on educational value, creativity, clarity, pacing, and technical quality (sound, lighting, etc.). Youth are encouraged to have fun and be creative in designing their video entries!

The Film Festival will be held in the Round House as an afternoon session of the Junior Breeder Livestock Symposium, March 25, at the Rutgers Cook Campus Farm. Welcome to part 1 of 4 of the new record book "how to" series!

Let's start with the basics first. What is a record book?



A record book is the record of what youth did and learned in the project

and documents goals, knowledge and skills gained, leadership experiences, awards earned, and service to the community.

Next up: Why do we keep record books?

The 4-H program has a long history of record keeping. The focus reflects the importance of this life skill in our daily lives. Record keeping in 4-H teaches valuable life skills and is an important part of completing each project. Record books help members set goals, keep track of activities, record events, track project costs, and a whole lot more! They also teach members valuable, lifelong skills in record keeping, accounting, reporting, and written communication.

The record books allow the member to tell how they have grown, what they have learned, and where they came up short. They also demonstrate the importance of keeping a written document on what they have done. Record books provide a written platform for goal setting and the actions needed to achieve those goals.

Most record books are specific to your project area. For example, if you are in a rabbit project, you would complete a rabbit/small animal record book. If your project area doesn't have a specific book, use the general 4-H record book.
